## NARRANDERA MEETING

On Wednesday, I will be in Narrandera at a meeting for all Riverina Principals whose schools are involved in 2010 National Partnership Low SES funding. We will be briefed on the accountability elements and associated timeframes for stringent reporting requirements. We will be looking at the Education Reform agenda, performance measures, semester 2 planning, regional priorities and support and using the revised Resource Planning Tool. We will be involved in a workshop where we will be reflecting on and sharing processes to date and discussing evaluation and monitoring of specific school targets. The benefits for our students of this National Partnership funding is well worth the effort associated with it.

## SCHOOL EXCURSION

Our primary excursion this year is to Borambola Sport and Recreation from Monday $18^{\text {th }}$ October until Friday $22^{\text {nd }}$ October (Week 2 Term 4) A $\$ 50$ deposit is required to confirm each child's place. Final numbers must be in by Friday $25^{\text {th }}$ June ( $2^{\text {nd }}$ last week). Please sign the attached note and return with your deposit by that date. Prompt responses will be much appreciated.

All students, Years 3-6 will have the opportunity to attend Borambola Sport and Rec from Monday $18^{\text {th }}$ October until Friday $22^{\text {nd }}$ October. Travel to and from the venue will be by Coach. The cost of the excursion is $\$ 250$ per child. The school will cover the cost of the bus and subsidise each child $\$ 50$ reducing the cost to $\$ 200$. The $\mathrm{P} \& \mathrm{C}$ usually also subsidise $\$ 50$ per child reducing the final cost of $\$ 150$. When the $\$ 50$ deposit is paid, the cost remaining will be $\$ 100$. This may be paid in instalments throughout Term 3. Full payment must be received by Wednesday $22^{\text {nd }}$ September.
