2016 NSW PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

Last week we had a special visit from our new Director, Mr David Lamb. He enjoyed meeting staff and students at our school and seeing what a fantastic school we have. The students loved his tour of their fairy garden.

SMALL SCHOOLS NETWORK

On Wednesday staff from our small schools network will be visiting to undertake classroom observations. They will be spending time in both the infants and primary classrooms. The observers will be concentrating their attention on gathering data on our Focus questions. For Round 2, these are:

- Is there evidence of students successfully using effective feedback to achieve the learning intention of the lesson?
- Was any evidence of reflective learning habits noticed?

On Thursday, Miss Clark and I will be travelling to Beckom and Binya to observe the learning in their classroom. We will join teams from Tallimba and Rankins Springs. At the conclusion of the day, all staff from Weethalle, Rankins Springs, Tallimba, Beckom and Binya will meet at Binya PS to debrief the findings of these Instructional Rounds observations. We will then decide on the next level of work required for our group. This will form the basis of learning for our next round of observations. Improvement in classroom practice and student learning is the focus of our Instructional Rounds teams.

Involvement in this project has been valuable professional learning.

All library books need to be returned to the School Library by Friday 1 July.


