Meegan McCarten Secretary of the Rankins Springs Branch of ICPA Meegan and I really enjoyed attending the Federal Conf. at Alice Springs on 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2017.

The NT committee did a fantastic job of supplying all the information, meals, venues and made it a Conference to remember. The high ight was the 'Dinner under the Stars' at a quarry outside of Alice. Spectacular scenery amongst the cliffs with fire buckets to ward of the cool winter night was topped off by a star gazing tutorial by the local ranger. Amazing food and drinks and a very furnry auction to raise funds completed the night before we were bussed back to our accommodation.

We found the motions and discussions from the NT, QLD, SA and WA members very interesting as they are so isolated compared to us here at Rankin Springs. The vast distances, methods of home schooling, internet connectivity or lack of, and just the general every day challenges that they take in their stride was very humbling. We have nothing to complain about compared to these amazing families.

Michael and Suzanne Wilson were a highlight as they spoke about the REACT program they have developed for Distance Education and how it works to make real time discussions between teachers and students. This makes the work flow so much quicker and makes the job of the supervisor - (usually MUM) much less stressful and demanding.

I found the talk by Connellans Airway Chairman – Mr Gavin Carpenter very interesting as I have a relationship to the founcer – Eddie Connellan. My maiden name is Connellan. The Trust provides not only monetary benefits to isolated people but enormous apportunity to travel and complete world class research and education programmes. They then impart this knowledge back into their local communities.

Continuing the family connection was my cousin Tiani Cook who is also the NT President. Tiani and a close friend completed a fundraising and awareness campaign for ICPA by riding their horses from her home - Suplejack Downs on the WA border of the Tanami Track to Darwin. A distance of 1000km in 30 days. The 1000kms was significant as that is how far Tiani drives her daughters to attend school get togethers at Darwin twice a year. Add wet weather road closures and one of the worst corrugated dirt roads in Australia, 45-degree heat, camels, kangaroos and crocodiles and it makes for an interesting 18hr drive!!

The keynote speaker at the Conf. was Nicole Gibson. Everyone should make time to find out about Nicole. Google her, Facebook her and as Molly Meldrum would say – Do yourself a favour and check it out!! She was very inspiring and motivating. Her message about how to relate to adversity and pick yourself up when things are going wrong was so simplistic but really got you thinking of how your reaction impacts the result. There was a lot more to Nicole's talk but do some research on her and read what she's all about.

The usual presidents report from each State highlighted the progress made by ICPA in the last year to help all members and they also reinforced the same motions and frustrations that crop up each year are still being seen as relevant and are not losing their importance.


Rankins Springs motioned were all passed.
