Melbourne Aquarium


At the Melbourne Aquarium there was a salt water crocodile who had been rescued. He was sick. They put him in a tank and put some fish friends with him.

walking around in circles. After a while it was getting a little bit late so we all went into our cabins. Then it was dinner.


For dinner we had a delicious BBO with lots of yummy sausages. Yum!

Grilled Chicken with Garlic and Parsley Ingredients

Serves: 6 125g butter

3 tablespoons minced garlic

3 tablespoons (60ml) soy sauce

1/4 teaspoon black pepper

1 tablespoon dried parsley

6 boneless chicken thighs, with skin

1 pinch dried parsley, to taste

Directions

Preparation:10min > Cook:20min > Ready in:30min

- 1. Preheat the griller. Lightly grease a baking tray.
- 2. In a microwave safe bowl, mix the butter, garlic, soy sauce, pepper and parsley. Cook 2 minutes on High in the microwave or until butter is melted.
- 3. Arrange chicken on the baking tray and coat with the butter mixture, reserving some of the mixture for basting.

Grill chicken 20 minutes until juices run clear, turning occasionally and basting with remaining butter mixture. Sprinkle with parsley to serve.

Garlic Bread

- 4 cloves garlic, crushed
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 loaf crusty bread, split
- 3 tablespoons grated cheese, Parmigiano or Romano, optional
- Chopped fresh parsley

Combine garlic, butter, and oil in a microwave safe dish or in a small saucepan. Heat garlic and butter and oil in microwave for 1 minute or in a small pot over moderate-low heat for 3 minutes.

Toast split bread under broiler. Remove bread when it is toasted golden brown in colour. Brush bread liberally with garlic oil. Sprinkle with cheese, if using, and parsley. If you added cheese, return to broiler and brown 30 seconds. Cut into chunks and serve.





Garlic and Herb Lamb Chops

Ingredients

- 2 Tablespoons olive oil
- 2 Tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- 4 garlic cloves
- I teaspoon chopped fresh rosemary
- I Tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
- I generous pinch sea salt
- 1/2 kilo lamb chops



Instructions

If your broiler is in your oven (not in a separate section below the main one), place your oven rack in the second highest position. Heat the broiler to high.

Combine the olive oil and lemon juice in a bowl or dish that's large enough to fit the lamb chops. Crush the garlic in a press (or use the flat side of a chef's knife to smash it, then finely mince) and add it to the dish. Stir in the rosemary, parsley, and salt.

Add the lamb chops, turning to coat. Arrange the lamb chops in a single layer on a broiler pan. Broil for 5 minutes.

Turn the lamb chops over and spoon on more of the marinade, so each lamb chops is coated with garlic and herbs. Broil another 5 minutes.
